Sharing and the City

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Cities have been places of sharing for centuries. People have shared goods and services, resources, spaces, knowledge and ideas, all of which have had an impact on citizens' livelihoods, prosperity and quality of life, and have kept cities buoyant.

But is all sharing good? Can sharing occur without the need for monetary exchange? Who really benefits from sharing? And are there opportunities to amplify or create new sharing experiences that push the boundaries so that cities are more liveable in the future in terms of using less carbon and resources, and increasing individual and community wellbeing?

This Skype session explores our current thinking around sharing, including how sharing currently occurs in cities. We discuss findings from two Spring workshops in which we spoke with community groups in Lancaster and Birmingham. We then talk about what cities can do to facilitate sharing at different scales, who needs/should be involved in sharing, what should be shared and how sharing should occur.
